PTSD: Differential Diagnosis and Comorbidities

PTSD commonly co-occurs with other psychiatric disorders. PTSD symptoms can also mimic other psychiatric conditions. This lecture will address some of the most common co-occurring conditions and how to elicit trauma history from patients who only report symptoms that match the co-occurring condition.

The Treatment of Complex Trauma

This presentation will cover a phase-based approach to the treatment of complex trauma, as recommended by the International Society for the Treatment of Trauma and Dissociation. Specific attention will be paid to Stage I stabilization, the neurobiology of trauma, and strategies for promoting integration and coherence through treatment.
